Outline of the proposed program of work:

For the first year, low impact field exploration is planned to include a review of all previous historical exploration in the area. Geophysical surveys and field reconnaissance trips will also be undertaken to identify further areas of interest, with minimal impact to the environment.

Should future higher impact exploration activities be planned such as exploration drilling, it will involve a submission of a low impact exploration plan or work plan to Earth Resources Regulation, detailed rehabilitation plans, and monitoring and auditing.

Throughout the exploration planning process, VHM will consult with individual land holders and the broader community and provide information on planned exploration activities and allow opportunities for feedback to be incorporated into the planning process.

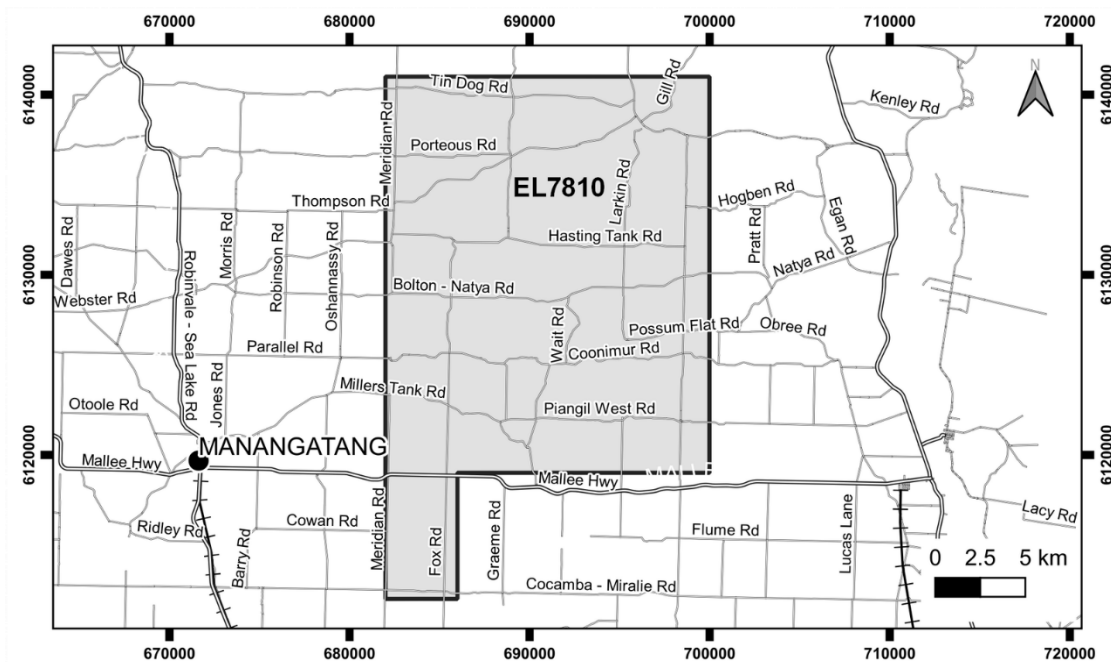


Figure 1: Location of EL007810

Community Consultation

Where an exploration activity is deemed to have wider community effects, these activities will be communicated via this website and in writing (letters/emails), as well as by phone calls and/or meetings with key stakeholders affected prior to engagement in the activity.

VHM will endeavour to address all concerns relating to its activities and provide transparent communication of information. It is in the best interests of VHM and the community to maintain good working relationships.
