# VHM commences trading on the Australian Securities Exchange (ASX)

Monday 9 January 2023 was an auspicious day on the VHM calendar when at 9.30 am, VHM Limited commenced trading on the ASX.

VHM successfully completed the Initial Public Offer (IPO) to raise funds which will be used to progress development activities for the Goschen project. These activities include continuing exploration for upstream projects and funding the company through to final investment decision in the latter half of 2023.

# VHM and Gannawarra Shire Council formalise their working relationship

VHM has worked closely with the Gannawarra Shire Council to develop a framework outlining how Council and VHM will communicate, their individual and joint responsibilities, and the flow-on benefits to the community from the development of the Goschen Rare Earths and Mineral Sands Project.

The resulting Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) focuses on maximising local community and business opportunities and outlines how the organisations will work cooperatively and collaboratively so that benefits to both the region and VHM are realised. Graham Howard, Managing Director of VHM Limited expressed his appreciation to Council for their interest in the Project and the positive working relationship already established.

"This MOU is an important document that maps our way forward in how we optimise social and economic outcomes, build relationships to support the Project, and develop a framework on how we contribute to the region," Mr Howard said.

"It's imperative to VHM that we invest in the people who will be directly or indirectly contributing to the Project and corresponding economic growth of the region. In addition, the Loddon Mallee region is an economic zone of significant importance for the Government's strategy to establish Australia as a global rare earths producer. Success of businesses and industry in the region is dependent on a strong community with supportive public services in place allowing everyone to thrive," Mr Howard said.

# **Exploration drilling recommences**

VHM commenced its exploration drilling programs at the Cannie and Nowie Prospects in February 2023. The Cannie Prospect is located approximately 11 kilometres south of the Goschen Project in Exploration Licence (EL) 6419 and EL 6664. The Nowie Prospect is located north of the Goschen Project, approximately 13.5 kilometres in EL 6666.

The planned program comprises up to 120 holes in Cannie and up to 70 holes in Nowie, totalling 5,700 metres of aircore drilling. The drill targets have been defined from historical drill data and geophysical airborne surveys that the Company undertook in 2021.

The primary objective of the drilling program is to define the extent of mineralisation across the tenement areas, and to support the potential for future maiden Mineral Resource estimates across both the Cannie and Nowie Prospects.

Other exploration activities include LiDAR (Light Detection and Ranging) aerial laser scanning which will take place in late April. A fixed wing aircraft flying at 1100 metres undertakes this work which is passive and does not impact people, animals or infrastructure in any way.

# **EES** community engagement

The last quarter of 2022 was a difficult time across the region with the severe impacts from the floods. As the region was isolated with so many road closures, we adapted our planned engagement in November to continue digitally via webinar.

We are now on the 'home stretch' with the EES process, and currently undergoing the Adequacy Review phase where the Minister for Planning reviews the EES document and endorses the EES to be publicly exhibited in the not-too-distant future.

The Minister will also announce the dates for public exhibition and we will continue with our community engagement across the region throughout that time.

The EES exhibition will be advertised and promoted widely, and how you can obtain information about the EES. We encourage everyone to become familiar with the proposed Goschen Project and make a submission on the EES to Planning Panels Victoria. Full details on how to obtain information about the EES, and our engagement schedule, will be provided.

Also available will be guidance on how to make a submission on the EES following the Minister's announcement of this next step in the process.

## The next step in EES process

Following the EES exhibition, a panel will be appointed by the Minister for Planning to hear submissions made about the EES and attached documents. The panel will host an Inquiry which may be conducted in person, on line video, or a combination of both.

The Inquiry interrogates the environment effects of the project and hears submitters who wish to present in person.

The panel will then make a recommendation to the Minister for Planning on whether the Goschen Project will meet environment effects, following which the Minister will make a determination.

# State Government

#### September 2018

VHM refers Goschen Project to the Minister for Planning (State Government) under the Environment Effects Act 1978.

# October 2018

Minister for Planning determines that Environment Effects Statement (EES) is required. Technical Reference Group (TRG) established by Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning (DELWP) to review EES.

#### February 2019

Draft Scoping Requirements for EES published for public comment. DELWP invite community to comment.

#### May 2019

Minister for Planning issues and publishes final Scoping Requirements for EES.

#### February – August 2019

Stakeholder and Community Reference Group activated and meetings held.

#### May 2019 – February 2020

VHM commences EES specialist studies and consults with community.

#### February 2020 – January 2022

All EES activity on hold due to COVID-19 pandemic.

#### February 2022

Resumption of TRG process.

#### February – December 2022

TRG meetings re-activated. Stakeholder and Community Reference Group re-activated. Community engagement program re-activated. Impact Assessments for Technical Studies being finalised.

#### Quarter 2 2023

VHM provides completed EES to DTP (formerly DELWP) for final review by DTP and seeks Minister's authorisation to exhibit the EES.

## Quarters 2 & 3 2023

VHM exhibits EES and Minister for Planning invites public comment.

Independent Inquiry and Advisory Committee considers EES and public submissions. Inquiry invites submitters to present in person.

Assessment of the EES by Minister for Planning.

Commonwealth Minister for Environment and Water then considers the State's assessment of the controlled actions under the EPBC Act.

PLEASE NOTE: Dates post-completion of the EES subject to consultation with the Department of Transport and Planning.
